Kuala Lumpur City Centre (KLCC)

The Kuala Lumpur City Centre Development strategically located within the Golden Triangle of Kuala Lumpur ranks among the largest real-estate developments in the world. The 40-hectare (100-acre) development is born of a vision to create a place

where people can work, live, visit, shop and enjoy leisure and cultural activities in a convenient and pleasant environment.

Designed as an integrated mixed-use development, it will ultimately provide more than 1.67 million sq. meters (18 million sq. feet) of commercial, retail, hotel, residential and entertainment facilities within a parking setting.



The master plan provides for 22 commercial developments to be located along the perimeter of a 50-acre landscaped park.

In line with KLCC's policy of undertaking commercial development solely in response to an identified demand, the 100-acre development is being undertaken in phases. Anchoring Phase One of the development is the North-West Development, which serves as the gateway to the development. Among the North-West developments are the 88-storey Petronas Twin Towers, the 6-Level Suria KLCC, a 20-hectare public park and a 6,000 capacity Mosque.
